



Q2 What is your gender identity?





Q10 How many years have you been licensed as an MFT?







Q14 On average, how many hours per week do you volunteer or provide pro-bono therapy?





Q15 What is your average annual income (before taxes)?







Q20 Do you consider your private practice your primary career/occupation and source of income?





Q21 What percentage of your gross income goes to overhead?





Q22 Have you experienced any changes in your earnings from providing psychotherapy within the past two years?





Q23 How much has your overhead increased in the last five years?







Q30 Approximately how long before you received a response from the insurance plan?









Q33 Are you a provider on PPO, HMO, EAP, or other managed care panels?





Q34 How often have you found it necessary to contact managed care companies to pre-authorize services?





Q35 When pre-authorization is required, how often have you successfully obtained the desired authorization for services?





Q36 Do you advocate for continued treatment for your clients?





Q37 In your experience, which of the following applies to the terms and conditions of managed care contracts?





Q38 Have you ever negotiated with a managed care company for an increase in your reimbursement?







Q44 What is your average annual income (before taxes) from:(Note: please provide information for all that apply)






Q71 What is the average number of hours of therapy you provide per week.







Q101 Which method do you use to offer CE coursework? (Check all that apply)





Q102 How do you prefer to fulfill your CE requirements?





Q108 How do you prefer to receive communications from CAMFT? (check all that apply)








