# Q9 If a Mental Health Pupil Personnel Services (PPS) credential was created, would you be interested in pursuing it in order to provide counseling to students in public schools?





Q14 On average, how many hours per week do you volunteer or provide pro-bono therapy?









## Q20 Do you consider your private practice your primary career/occupation and source of income?





### Q21 What percentage of your gross income goes to overhead?





## Q22 Have you experienced any changes in your earnings from providing psychotherapy within the past two years?





### Q23 How much has your overhead increased in the last five years?











## Q34 How often have you found it necessary to contact managed care companies to pre-authorize services?





# Q35 When pre-authorization is required, how often have you successfully obtained the desired authorization for services?





#### Q36 Do you advocate for continued treatment for your clients?





# Q37 In your experience, which of the following applies to the terms and conditions of managed care contracts?













### Q102 How do you prefer to fulfill your CE requirements?





# Q108 How do you prefer to receive communications from CAMFT? (check all that apply)





## Q109 What CAMFT member benefits do you consider to be most beneficial? (Check all that apply)






